**Persistence Works' is the UK's first purpose built fine art and craft studio complex in Sheffield. It provides a permanent new base for the Society with 51 studios, support services and specialized equipment along with public activity spaces.**

Persistence Works is part of the regeneration of an area of Sheffield known as Cultural Industries Quarter (CIQ). Yorkshire Artspace was awarded £3.7m from the National Lottery through the Arts Council of England and approximately £1.5m from ERDF.

This funding supports a programme of events for artists, crafts people and the community as well as the building. Persistence Works received RIBA Award 2002.
